WORKING to CREATE a MORE JUST and PEACEFUL WORLD for OUR FAMILIES

U.S. Labor Against the War (USLAW) was founded prior to the war at a Chicago conference in January of 2003 by more than 200 delegates from unions, labor councils, regional and state labor bodies, allied constituency groups, labor antiwar committees, worker centers and other labor organizations. Ten months later USLAW held a National Labor Assembly for Peace to create a permanent leadership structure and ongoing program to end the war and occupation, demilitarize U.S. foreign policy, redirect the resources of the nation to meet human needs, and to reverse the erosion of our liberties and rights.

SOME of USLAW'S MAJOR ACTIVITIES and ACHIEVEMENTS

- ☑ Helped pass antiwar resolutions in hundreds of unions, labor councils, union conventions and other labor bodies.
- ☑ Organized to win adoption of a resolution in 2005 that put the AFL-CIO on record against the war and called for rapid withdrawal of all U.S. troops.
- ☑ Sent two delegations of union activists to Iraq to investigate the conditions of workers and their unions there and report back to the labor movement here.
- ☑ Launched a campaign in support of labor rights in Iraq and sponsored U.S. tours for Iraqi labor leaders in 2005 and 2007 that reached thousands of working people directly and hundreds of thousands more through media reports.

- ☑ Produced a video documentary, "Meeting Face to Face: U.S. Iraq Labor Solidarity Tour" about the 2005 U.S. tour of Iraqi labor leaders.

- ☑ Mobilized unions in solidarity with trade unionists under attack in Iraq to demand the Iraqi government and U.S. military honor and respect labor rights.
- ☑ Exposed the scheme to put Iraqi oil under control of multinational oil companies and to privatize Iraq's public sector work.
- ☑ Produced "The Real Price of Occupation" video slide show to show how the war and bloated military budget affect working people, veterans and social programs.
- ☑ Participated in every major national antiwar demonstration; organized labor antiwar rallies and contingents, including 15,000-union members who marched in the April, 2006 NYC that drew 350,000 people.
- ☑ Produced and distributed thousands of labor antiwar buttons & bumper stickers.
- ☑ Initiated Students & Educators to Stop the War Conferences in NY, LA and Oakland
- ☑ Brought Iraq War and other veterans, members of military families and Gold Star parents to speak at union meetings and events, and mobilized union members to support proper care and full benefits for all veterans.
- ☑ Developed a website that has one of the largest archives on the Internet of material on the Iraqi labor movement, the war and the movement to end it.
- ☑ Authored a ballot initiative in 2006 in San Francisco calling for immediate withdrawal from Iraq that garnered 64% of the vote.
- ☑ Has become the most credible labor voice of opposition to U.S. policy in Iraq and Afghanistan across the U.S. and around the world.
